- Compostable materials must be in your green cart.
- Garbage must be in clear non coloured bags.

Dual Stream Recycling Program



June 1st Voluntary Phase
December 1st Mandatory Phase

All residents and businesses, in Cumberland County will soon be required to participate in Dual Stream Recycling!

Phase 1, the Voluntary Phase, will take place over a 6 month period commencing **June 1st, 2018**. During this phase individuals will be encouraged to participate in the program as this will allow residents & businesses to have any questions or concerns addressed before the Mandatory Phase.

Phase 2, the Mandatory Phase, will begin **December 1st, 2018**. As of this date recyclables will not be collected if they are not in separate bags (Bag #1– Recyclable Paper Products & Bag #2 Recyclable Containers).

What is Dual Stream Recycling?

Dual stream recycling is where recyclables are sorted in two separate bags. All paper products (newspaper, cardboard, cereal boxes, etc.) are collected in one bag and all container products (milk cartons, tin cans, plastics, etc.) are collected in another. Please see reverse for sort guide.

Why do I need to separate my recyclables into two bags?

Market conditions are dictating that we need a cleaner product which can only be achieved with dual stream recycling.

Do I need to use two different colored bags for my recyclables?

No, there is no need to use different colored bags for your recyclable paper products and recyclable containers. All recyclables can be placed in either clear non colored or transparent blue bags.

Is there a change to my recycling bag limit?

No, your bag limit will remain the same.
